Budget Update from your Treasurer

The Income/Expense Report below looks ok, but as they say "looks can be deceiving."

At the January Congregational Meeting, Session presented the 2023 budget which projected a \$30,000 deficit. The budget also included using the 2022 budget surplus (half due to the vacant Pastor position; ½ year vacancy in both Ukirk & Older Adult Ministry positions; decreased Summer GiFT expenses; decreased non worship childcare; etc.)

Traditionally, giving decreases during the summer months. This financial snapshot will likely show negative numbers by the end of summer.

Bottom line: if all predicted giving is received and all budgeted funds are spent, FPC will end with a \$30,000 deficit in 2023.

Letter from Kati

Acts 1:8b "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

I was amazed at the willingness of people to tell their stories on Pentecost Sunday. I had heard about the moving stories told in Pentecost worship services of the past (going back more than 20 years!). This year did not disappoint! We had a large crowd, and many stories were told of the movement of the Holy Spirit in the lives of our members and in the life of this church. Stories about healing, stories about how the people they have met in this church have shown a living example of grace, stories about what it means to have a church family, stories about finding support and encouragement when you are looking for direction.

Before worship we had posters sharing some of the responses to our Congregational Visioning Survey. The Growth and Sustainability Taskforce has completed their summaries of the responses and their research, and they will report to the Session on June 20th. After that, the report will be shared among committees. Some of the most remarkable things I have heard over and over about this church, from small groups and individual surveys, are that we are "Always asking questions, not just following what people say," we have "vibrant and active youth and children's programs", and "We welcome all, work for social justice, serve those in need, and love because Jesus taught and commanded this." Many people want this to be true of their church, but few churches stand up to the test. From what I have seen over the last six months, you truly love Jesus, you love people, and you use your hands and words to show what that means. You welcome all, because that is how you read the Bible and how you feel called by Jesus to love EVERYONE. This church has something very relevant and unique in our divided and troubled times.

You are also not afraid to talk about difficult things. One of the hardest questions in the survey was confronting the challenges of financial management in a time where the price of groceries has skyrocketed and inflation has climbed quicker than the average income rates. The problems our church faces are no different than any household or organization. As one of our trustees puts its, "Our congregation is a home owner, and this home experiences a lot of traffic with all of our residents and guests. So naturally, we have to plan for the repairs and construction that result from active use and life." Plus, in our service oriented culture, there are many organizations doing important and relevant things, so how do we engage our members into a stewardship effort with sustainable use of the finances we have available to us? Some of your responses asked for more information about our finances, and others asked for easier ways to give in worship. Your stewardship and finance committee would agree, and they are already preparing a more informative and engaging season this fall.

As this church continues into a new season, we are embracing the opportunity to remember why we do what we do and believe what we believe. Larry James, the leader of CitySquare, a nonprofit fighting poverty in Dallas through service, advocacy, and friendship, says "Roadblocks often signify you're headed in exactly the hard, difficult direction that current circumstances demand." What ministry of this church feeds your soul? Who do you know outside of this church that could benefit from the support and grace we know from Jesus? Stay tuned to be a part of this next chapter in the life of our church, as we lean into grace and share love with our community.

Preschool Update

Summer is here! In May we celebrated the end of another wonderful school year. The teachers at preschool give their all and pour love into our families and their children!
