The story of the Magi holds a certain mystery and direction for us, calling us to observe, ponder and go looking for the presence of God in our world. Over the last decade many people have focused on a Word for the year as a practice to extend this observation of one aspect of our lives throughout the different seasons and passing of time. Christians like us have been calling them Star Words in an effort to make this a more spiritual experience. We choose a word and observe our lives

alongside this word, and along the way, we let the word whisper to us guidance from God or lead us to find evidence of God's activity in our lives. Like a star lighting the way, the word leads us to The Word of God and brings the Light of Christ into our everyday experiences.

This year we offer you 3 different ways to choose your word:

First of all, you may choose from the words we will be using for Advent. 


CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING: SUPPORTING OUR PAST, PRESENT, AND FUTURE LEADERS

For families with children of all ages




This year we are inviting families to take part in AdventWord organized by Forward Movement (see below for details) and we have created a Family Advent Calendar that follows the same words from that list.





PW News

PW/Circle will meet Wednesday, December 13, at 10:00 am in Fellowship Hall. Laura Southard will lead the Bible Study, Sacred Encounters: The Power and Presence of Jesus Christ in Luke-Acts, Lesson Four: Mary and Martha Encounter Jesus. Following the lesson, the women will participate in the Fellowship of the Least Coin "noisy offering" which brings about connection, comfort, reconciliation, peace and justice throughout the world through grants given to projects, scholarships, and relief effort that have been supported by prayers and least coins. In 1956, when Shanti Solomon envisioned this prayer movement, she saw it as global and ecumenical, rooted in the pursuit of wholeness for all people.

In November the women participated in the Thank Offering with a collection of \$521.00. Received in the fall each year it gives women a tangible way to express their gratitude for the special blessings in their lives. Thank Offering Grants range from \$5,000 to \$50,000. At least 40% of the offering funds health ministries. Since 1988, Presbyterian Women have granted more than \$27 million to nearly 1,700 different projects worldwide through the Thank Offering.

An Update from Your Pastor Nominating Committee

Over the last year, the Pastor Nominating Committee has diligently evaluated candidates to serve as our next Head of Staff. The process has been overwhelmingly successful, with numerous candidates matching with and applying for our opening. Through thoughtful consideration and discernment, we narrowed the candidate pool down to three exceptionally qualified candidates with whom we had deep conversations and hosted one for an inperson interview a few weeks ago.

Following those conversations, one candidate withdrew from consideration due to family issues. A second candidate also withdrew but did not provide specific reasons for discontinuing the process. We hosted the third candidate for an in-person interview in Stillwater and, following that visit, the PNC unanimously agreed to extend an offer to this individual. After careful consideration, the candidate decided that they are feeling called to ministry outside the church and declined our offer.

The PNC is reviewing our processes, gathering feedback from the three former candidates, and determining next steps. At this time, we are not engaged in any conversations with candidates, and we expect the Advent season to slow the search process until early 2024.

We understand there may be unease and apprehension, but we ask for your patience. If you have specific questions or concerns for the PNC, please contact a member of the committee directly.

Session Summary

The Session met on November 14th, with Pastor Kati moderating and Kathy Thomas acting as clerk. Highlights include

- Capital Needs-The Trustees have been gathering bids for repair and installment of a new sanctuary roof and substantial repairs to our geothermal heating and cooling units. Support was voiced for a capital campaign pending followup with Trustees about the breadth of the needs. Attendees voiced the need for clear goals and communication of a campaign, and the use of a consultant was discussed.
- PNC report--Tim Schlais encouraged the Session to decide about the Associate Pastor position, relaying that candidates declined the position because of the uncertainty. Candidates want us to be more definitive about future plans. Therefore, the Session approved the following motion:
 - The Session resolved not to fill the Associate Pastor position in 2024, and re-evaluate the position in 2024. (Note: the position is not in the current budget.) The three professional positions, Senior Pastor, Associate Pastor, and Director of Family and Youth, will be evaluated by Personnel to determine the needs of the church and adjust positions accordingly.
- Endowment requests were approved to send gifts as have been received to the New Covenant Trust Company Endowment. Funds as allocated for resource accounts were also approved.
- Personnel Policy changes and additions were approved:
 - a.Extension and modifications done to Pastor Kati's Contract, allowing 60 day notice for a transition of leadership.
 - b. Revisions to the existing Professional & Work Expenses Policy Approved
 - c.Revisions to the Sabbatical Guidelines (now Sabbatical Policy) Approved.
 - d. New policy for Credit Card Assignment & Usage Approved.
- Stewardship and Finance shared that as of 11/14 we had 104 pledges with \$557,000 pledged, leaving 20 people who have pledged previously but not this year.
- \$45 was collected for the Saturday Brunch.

Next stated meeting Tuesday, December 12th at 5:30pm in Fellowship Hall. This meeting will include the examination of new officers.

Trustees are actively pursuing solutions for a variety of problems. We're waiting to hear from three companies on an insurance policy to make sure we're financially protected. Our HVAC system has suffered deterioration over the years but steps are being taken to define the repair costs and install upgrades where needed. With 19 air handler units providing heat and air conditioning year-round, it's been a real challenge. Billy McCollum and his crew have installed new carpet in several rooms (check out how beautiful the Worship Center now looks with its sparkling new carpet!). We're also studying how to finance future projects such as sanctuary roof replacement and a long list of needed upgrades and repairs.

And some good news! We've noticed that there are fewer leaks since we re-shingled the Fellowship Hall, preschool and administrative offices.


