Prelude: This is Michael Bedford's (b. 1949) new setting of hymn #175 in *Glory to God*, in which he highlights both the melody and its descant line in various parts of the texture. Michael is Organist/Choirmaster Emeritus at St. John's Episcopal Church in Tulsa, and he still sings in that choir when not substituting for other organists in the area. He played here at FPC twice last summer during Becky's absence, and performed an *SDG* recital for us in 2019.

Anthem: Walter Pelz (b. 1926) is Professor Emeritus on the music faculty of Bethany College in Lindsborg, Kansas, where he taught for many years. He is a prolific and esteemed composer of organ and choral music. We sincerely thank Choral Scholars Vanessa Washburn and MaryEllen Bush for all their hard work in preparing for their instrumental collaboration with the choir!


